Update from this week

It was great to see so many guests at our **Father's Day breakfast** yesterday. As always, Mrs Rogage provided delicious bacon sandwiches for the children and their guests. The winner of our raffle was Katie's dad in Year 4. Photographs are on our school Facebook page.

We look forward to seeing more of you at our Father's Day lunch on Monday. We are fully booked so I'm

sure it will be another fantastic event. Please come to the school office for 12:30pm. Unfortunately, we do not have anywhere for you to wait while the hall is still out of action.

We've had our whole school visit to the **aquarium** today, which was planned to end the **whole school text** week. Our whole school text is "The Mess That We Made" by Michelle Lord.

This is a book about the impact of waste and pollution on the environment, and how we can make changes to save the planet.

The book has been the stimulus for our work this week and for our visit to the aquarium. The children visit the aquarium, took part in an eco-workshop and visited the



beach for beach art, sand castle building and beach games. We will include more information about the visit in next week's newsletter.

We are still operating without the **hall**. The dehumidifiers have been running non-stop for a fortnight now to try to dry out the hall. Tests were done on Wednesday and the floor is still not dry. Contractors will be back at school next week to check the floor again.

This week has been very busy with Year 1 phonics screening checks, Year 2 phonics screening rechecks, Key stage 1tests and Year 4 Multiplication Tables Check. These are all national tests for all children across the country in these year groups.

All Year 2 children have completed the **key stage 1 tests** in reading, spelling, punctuation and grammar (SPAG) and maths. Some children in Green class and all children in Red class have completed the **Phonics Screening Check**. The children had to read some very tricky words and alien words. All children in Blue class completed the Year 4 **Multiplication Tables Check**. This is an online multiplication test consisting of 25 questions.

Our approach to these tests with the children is to be as **low key** as possible. We tell the children that they are doing a special job, as we do not want them to feel worried by using the word "test". The children all tried very hard, and that is all we can ask of them. We are much more interested in teacher assessment, which gives us a more holistic picture of what the children can do throughout the year, rather than on just one day. Well done boys and girls.

If your child has been completing tests this week, their results will be included in their **annual report**.

I have been spoken to again this week by concerned families regarding **parents and carers parking on the double yellow lines** on Barrass Avenue. We fought for a long time to get the double yellow lines to keep out children safe, so it is hard to see our own families parking on the lines. Please don't park on the double yellow lines.
