Purple class

Children in Purple class are working with **Seven Stories** on a project called '**Whose Books Are These Anyway**?' This project is fully funded, and we have been very lucky to be chosen to take part. We have had workshops in school from Seven Stories staff and the children have visited Seven Stories and **Newcastle Central Library**.

At **Seven Stories** the children listened to some stories about climate change, had a debate and then created their own posters. They then held a mini protest using their posters. Then the children were allowed to see and hold some original artwork, some drawn by Axel Scheffler. Then they were able to look around the galleries at other Author's work.


At the **Newcastle Central Library** they got to visit Seven Stories archives with original artwork and stories by hundreds of authors, including Nick Sharrat and Judith Kerr. They also saw Michael Murpurgo's orange notebooks, which he used to write all of his books.

Early Years focus

In Early Years we have been looking at feeling and emotions. We create our own self portraits and made pizza faces which were really yummy. We discussed our likes and dislikes and the children chose their own toppings for their pizza.



One of our key texts this half term is 'The Colour Monster'. We have explored colours in the tuff tray learning about dark and light colours and how colours can change. We have also linked colours to our emotions and the children chose a colour depending on how they were feeling.
