Reminder about the Seghill First School Pedestrian and Cycle Zone

I am writing to parents and carers again about the **Seghill First School Pedestrian and Cycle Zone.** Thank you to those of you who follow the rules of the scheme and support us to keep our children safe before and after school. We all know that this is the very vast majority of parents and carers. Sadly, we still have about half a dozen parents and carers who chose not to follow the rules of the zone and who drive on Cheviot View during restricted times and stop on the zig zags outside school.

We have requested regular visits from the County's **parking enforcement team**. They visited school on Wednesday and gave out some fixed penalty notices. We are also liaising with the **police** to deal with the small number of parents who still break the rules of the zone on a daily basis.

We fought for a long time to get this zone in place in order to **keep our children safe**. **Our children and your children**. However, if something happens to one of the children, it is highly likely that the perpetrator will be one of our parents.

Our previous pleas to the small number of parents who think that the rules do not apply to them have been ignored. I really don't know how much more we can do to bring about a change in behaviour. Sadly, it will probably take a really serious incident in order for this to happen.

Advance notice of World Book Day arrangements

Staff are planning activities to take place on World Book Day on **Thursday 07 March** Mrs Watson has a **£1 book voucher** for every child. In addition to this, she has also managed to secure a **free copy of one of the £1 World Book Day books** for every child in the school.

Please note that **we will be dressing up this year for World Book Day**. We agreed some time ago that we would dress up every other year, and as we didn't dress up last year, we will be dressing up this year.

The **coffee morning** will be taking place in the hall on **Thursday 07 March** from **8:45am**. Books will be available at the coffee morning so children can pick one from the selection. There will be no charge for this.

If you wish to **donate any children's books**, please send them into school by Wednesday 06 March.

Hot drinks and juice will also be available. In order to limit the financial burden on parents and carers, we will be charging **£1 per adult** to enter the coffee morning, but there will be no charge for hot drinks. Children will also be provided with a drink.

Any money raised from the entry fee will be used directly to **buy books for our children**.

Early Years toilets refurbishment

We are delighted to announced that the **Early Years toilets** and individual **wash basins** are being removed and replaced over the half term holidays. This is something we have wanted to do for some time now, and look forward to seeing our spangly new toilets, cubicles and hand washing trough after the holidays. There is also going to be substantial work done to the **floor** around this area to replace rotten flooring and underflooring with lovely new and safe flooring.

This work is costing school **£13,000**. It is being paid for from our Devolved Formula Capital fund, which can only be used to pay for improvements to the building. As you can imagine, the demand on this fund is massive for a school of our age, so we need to plan what we are going to do and when were going to do it. We do get money put into this fund every year, so we have prioritised the Early Years toilets this time.

In the **payments section**, please pick either Thursday 07 March Mother's Day lunch OR Friday 08 March Mother's Day lunch. Add your choice to the **basket** and then **pay**. If you would like a meat free choice on Friday, please email Miss Best at <u>admin@seghill.northumberland.sch.uk</u> so it is pre-ordered for you.

The payment portal is **open now** and will close on **Friday 01 March**. We will not be reopening the payment portal after this date as the food has to be ordered by this date.

Places for each Mother's Day lunch are limited to 40 guests per day. If children do not have contact with their mam they are welcome to invite a **special female** from their family, such as an **aunt, grandma or important female family friend**. We can only accommodate one guest per family.

Children will be able to eat their lunch with their guest. Children should ask for a school meal or packed lunch as normal during registration. If your child is in Orange class and they do not usually stay for lunch please make sure that they ask for a school meal on that day or provide a packed lunch for them.

You will be issued with a ticket when we have received your payment. We will send out more information about the timings for the sittings (two per day) nearer the time.
