

Children in **Purple class** started off the week with their **class assembly** on Monday afternoon in great style. The children told us about their learning from their visit to Vindolanda and shared their trumpet skills via a music lesson. They also tested us with a tricky quiz about the facts they had learnt at Vindolanda to check that we had been listening.

It was fabulous to see all of the children joining in and looking and sounding so confident. You've set a very high bar of the others to follow. Great job Year 3 and Mrs Thomas.

Year 1 visited the **synagogue** in Gosforth on Thursday morning. The children had a brilliant time. They saw many Jewish artefacts including the synagogue's Torah scroll. Lesley from the synagogue told us that they don't normally have children as young as Year 1 at the synagogue for school visits. However, she said she was absolutely amazed by how much our children already new about Judaism, how relevant their questions were and their level of interest. This is so pleasing to hear and echoes what was said about our Year 1 children when they visited the Grainger Market.

Year 2 and Year 3 visited the **Whitley Bay Islamic Cultural Centre** on Thursday afternoon. Miss Winter said that Year 2 and 3 had a fabulous time at the mosque. They observed a prayer session and looked inside the Qur'an. The children then asked to joined in with the prayer movements. Mrs Watson said that the children were really interested in everything they saw and heard. Our host Syed was very impressed with the children's knowledge of Islam. Again, it is so great to hear that our children in Years 2 and 3 have gone out of school to visit a place of worship and been excellent ambassadors for our school.

Feedback from both visits clearly shows that **RE teaching in school is very good**, as the hosts of our visits yesterday would not have been as impressed as they were with the children's knowledge of two world religions.

It was lovely to see **Mrs Miller** in school for a visit this week. Mrs Miller retired at Christmas, but called in to see everyone on Wednesday. She is enjoying spending more time with her family, but loved seeing all of the children and staff again.

Father's Day breakfast and Father's Day lunch are for dads, grandads, uncles, brothers or a special male from your family. We can only accommodate one guest per family and your guest can attend one of the events.

We are offering these opportunities for Father's Day on two different days so that we can provide the best possible experiences to our guests.

Thursday

On Thursday, children can be provided with a bacon sandwich to eat while sitting with their guest. This is entirely optional. A bacon sandwich for a child costs £2.00. A bacon sandwich and a hot drink for guests cost £4.00.

Monday

On Monday, children will be provided with their school meal and will be able to eat their meal while sitting with their guest. Meals for guests cost £4.50.

How to book a ticket

If you would like to attend either event, please use the booking system on School Gateway. In the payments section, please pick either **Thursday 12 June Father's Day breakfast** OR **Monday 16 June Father's Day lunch**. Add your choice to the basket and then pay. If you would like a **meat free choice**, please email Miss Best at schooladmin@seghillschool.co.uk so it is pre-ordered for you. The payment portal is open now and will close on **Friday 06 June.** We will not be reopening the payment portal after this date as the food has to be ordered by then.

Arrangements

Breakfast will be served at 9:00am on Thursday 12 June. Please drop your child off at their classroom and come to the school hall.

Lunch will be served between 11:45am and 1:00pm on Monday 16 June. There will be more than one sitting for lunch on Monday. The timing for your lunch will be on your ticket.

Places for each event are limited to 40 guests per day. You will be issued with a ticket before the events.

If your child is in **Orange class** and they do not usually stay for lunch, please make sure that they ask for a school meal on Monday 16 June or provide a packed lunch for them.
