

We were all utterly enthralled and inspired by Daisy. It was an absolute privilege to have her in school.

Thank you to everyone who supported this event and handed in sponsor money. I am delighted to announce that we raised **£766.50 so far, with at least another £400 pledged**. Well done everyone. The children had a great time taking part in their sports events this week. Children in **Early Years** had their sports morning yesterday morning. Unfortunately, I was in a meeting all morning, but Mrs Kembrey and Mrs Askew said all of the children did a brilliant job and tried hard with all of the different activities.

The children in **key stages 1 and 2** had their sports afternoon this afternoon. Again, they did a great job until the rain came and we had to finish early. We had hoped to dodge the rain, but it just came down too hard to continue. Controlling the weather is still a skill for us to master for next time.

Eat, sleep, play, learn fund reminder

Last year, Northumberland County Council allocated the **Eat, Sleep, Play, Learn fund** to support our children and young people, which was part of the council's response to cost-of-living pressures.

The fund was very well received across the County and received over 500 applications for support. The county council have now refreshed the fund to ensure it is continuously responding to the needs of our residents and helping to alleviate any obstacles which are causing financial difficulty and having a direct impact on a child's life.

Last year our school helped quite a few of our families who benefitted directly from the Eat, Sleep, Play, Learn fund, with items such as pillows, duvets and bedding.

To access the fund, we need to **make a referral for the fund on your behalf**. If you think there is something that you would like help with, please let us know and we will make a referral to the fund for you.

Class teachers for next year

As we start to head towards the end of term, we are already planning for the school year ahead. Next year, the school budget allows us to continue to have **6 single aged classes** in our school from Nursery to Year 4. It may not be the case that we are able to offer six single aged class from 2025, but that is something we will look at nearer the time. Our largest class is currently 22 children. This means that your child is taught in a smaller than average class and they get lots more attention from the adults who work with them.

Class teachers had **transition meetings** this week to share information about the children in their class. Children will be given opportunities to **visit their new classrooms** and **get to know their teachers** on multiple occasions between now and the end of term to ensure they are prepared for the move into a new class in September.

Reminder about Year 4 transition week beginning Monday 08 July

On **Monday 08 July** and **Tuesday 09 July**, children will be here at our school working with Mrs Lyons. They will start their transition week project on Monday and Tuesday. If your child is going to Whytrig, they will go to another SVLP first school on Monday and Tuesday.

On Wednesday, Thursday and Friday, Year 4 children will spend each day at their middle school. Morning sessions at middle school will start at 9:15am on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday and end at 3:00pm. This is to allow parents to drop off siblings at feeder first schools and to alleviate potential traffic congestion caused by additional vehicles carrying first school children to middle school sites. Please note that transport to and from middle school on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday is not provided. It is the responsibility of Year 4 parents and carers to drop off and collect their child at middle school on these three days.

Nursery and Reception class assembly Friday 05 July

The school is covering the **entire cost** of the trip so it is accessible to all pupils. This includes the cost of the coach, entry into the park and access to all rides and attractions.

Please remember that we will leave school at **8:15am**. This is so we can make the most of having a full day in the park. We will not be able to wait for latecomers. **Please arrive at school at 8:00am**.

We are leaving the park at 4:00pm and will be back at school at **approximately 5:30 - 6:00pm**. Again, this is so we can stay in the park for as long as possible. Our journey time will entirely depend on traffic. We will keep you up to date with our expected return time via messages on School Gateway.
