Cold weather

It's been really cold this week and we know that the school has felt cold at the beginning of the day. This is because the control panel on the boiler is broken. The system that switches the heating on automatically is broken, therefore the heating has to be switched on manually when Mr Ruler arrives at school. It does time a long time for the heat to spread through the school and warm up. The quote for the cost of the repair is nearly £4000. We do not have this money available in the school budget. We have applied for, and been granted, funding for this. We are now waiting for the repair to be carried out.

In the meantime, class teachers will be trying to keep their rooms warm by keeping their **classroom door closed**, and opening the doors to allow children in on arrival at 8:45am. If your classroom door is closed when you arrive, please knock and staff will let you in.

It is also a good idea to wear a **vest or an extra t-shirt** under the school top to keep warm. We have spare jumpers and cardigans if you would like one. Please just ask. Many children have been bringing a **hat and gloves** to keep warm while playing outside, which is always a good idea.

Mrs Rogage continue to make delicious hot school meals every day. Having a **hot meal** at lunchtime is another good way to keep warm. The menu is on the front page of the school website via the lunchtime menu button. Children can have a school meal on any day you wish. They just ned to ask for one during registration.

Family Learning for Years 1 and 2

We are delighted to announce that we have been chosen for Family Learning sessions again this year. Last year, we had three Family Learning projects in school, all of which were very successful.

This year we are hosting Multiply Family Learning sessions. The Multiply Family Learning project is about increasing confidence in using maths, and the aim is that families working on fun maths games and activities will learn together, improving their skills and confidence. The sessions are open to adults who do not have a level 2 maths qualification and, following the Family Learning course, adults will have the opportunity to progress onto a maths qualification. Family Learning can support them in this and have tutors who work flexibly one to one or with small groups of adults to help them achieve qualifications if they want to take their learning further outside school.


