Children should wear a **plain white t-shirt, plain black or navy joggers or shorts, trainers and their school sweatshirt or cardigan** to school on their PE days. Please ensure long hair is tied back for PE. Children cannot wear earrings for PE. If your child cannot remove their own earrings they should not wear them on PE days. Year 4 are at Ford Castle and taking part in cycling next half term, so they don't have PE in summer term A.

VE Day celebrations Thursday 08 May

In order to commemorate VE day, we are asking children and staff to dress in **red**, white and blue on **Thursday 08 May**.

This year it is the 80th anniversary of VE Day. We will be talking to children about the significance of VE Day.

At lunchtime we will be having a **garden party** and we will all be eating our lunch together outside (weather permitting). The menu for the day will be a **packed lunch**. Sandwiches will be made to order by Mrs Rogage and the choices are cheese, tuna or ham. Your child will be asked to state their choice of sandwich during registration next Thursday. Please

note that we are not serving hot meals on VE Day. If you do not want a packed lunch from school for your child, please provide them with a packed lunch.

Summer uniform

Hopefully we will continue to see lots of this lovely weather and children can wear summer uniform if they chose to. Here is a reminder of our policy on school uniform and seasonal variations-

School uniform

red sweatshirt or cardigan* white or red polo top*

grey or black skirt, trousers or pinafore black flat heeled shoes or boots

Items marked with * carry the school logo and can be bought from the school office.

Seasonal variations

In the summer children may wear a red gingham school dress or black or grey shorts (short school trousers). They can also wear flat heeled sandals with socks in the summer. Open-toe sandals, flip flops and Crocs are not appropriate for school.

Please ensure that all school uniform and PE kit, especially jumpers, cardigans and coats, are clearly named.

Jewellery

We would prefer it if children did not wear jewellery to school. However, children can wear a **watch**. Children with pierced ears can wear **one pair of small, plain stud earrings**. All other forms of jewellery are not allowed.

As we are offering games night, we will not be offering after school club on Wednesday 21 May.

Summer term class coffee mornings

Our **class coffee mornings** will be taking place next week at 8:50am. The format of the class coffee morning this term will be **workshops for parents and their children**.

Teachers will be planning workshops with a **maths focus**. Parents will be able to work with their children at the workshops. A raffle ticket will be given to every adult who attends and there will be a prize for each class.

Each class has different plans depending on how they are setting up, so please wait for the directions from the class teacher.

Leave of absence during term time requests

As we move into the summer term, we tend to receive an increased number of **leave of absence during term time requests**. We do completely understand that the cost of family holidays during the school holidays can be astronomical. However, we have a **legal duty** to follow the law around attendance, including only authorising leave of absence requests that have evidence of exceptional circumstances and referring to the Local Authority for a fixed penalty notice to be issued for all unauthorised leave of absence requests.

Parents and carers requesting leave of absence during term time must submit the request at least **two** weeks in advance using the leave of absence during term time form.

The only leave of absence during term time requests that will be authorised are those where **evidence** of exceptional circumstances is provided.

Leave of absence that is taken **without a leave of absence request form** being submitted will not be authorised and will trigger an application from school to the Local Authority for a fixed penalty notice to be issued.

Leave of absence that is taken which **has not been authorised** is extremely likely to trigger an application from school to the Local Authority for a fixed penalty notice to be issued.
