Year 4 cycling

Children in Year 4 worked with **Richard Rothwell** and **Mrs Lyons** this week on our aim for **all children to be** able to safely ride a bike by the time they leave Year 4.

The children were split in to two groups. Group 1 worked on the yard and in the local area all day on Tuesday and on Wednesday morning. They then completed a 4.5 mile ride on Tuesday then a 6 mile ride on Wednesday morning. Some of the children could not ride a bike or had not completed a bike ride before, so this is an amazing achievement.

Group 2 worked with Richard and Mrs Lyons on Wednesday afternoon and all day Thursday. They also worked on the yard and in the local area then they completed a mammoth 16 mile bike ride to Collywell Bay and back. What a fantastic achievement.

Richard had to use more tricky and more challenging routes due to Jolley's Track being completely flooded.

Very well done to all the boys and girls. Thank you to Richard for all of his help and support. A special thanks to Mrs Lyons, who spent 3 days outside and clocked up nearly 30 miles in bike rides this week.

National testing in Years 1, 2 and 4

All children in all schools across the country in Years 1 and 4 will be completing some tests this term. These tests are set by the Department for Education and are used in all schools across the country.

Children in **Year 4** complete the **Multiplication Tables Check**. The purpose of the Multiplication Tables Check is to determine whether pupils can recall their times tables fluently, which is important now and in later life. Children in **Year 1** complete the **Phonics Screening Check**. The purpose of the Phonics Screening Check is to see if your child can use and apply their phonological knowledge to both real words and nonsense words. Click here for the link to the information booklet for parents.

In previous years, it was statutory for children in **Year 2** to complete the **end of key stage 1 assessments**. These tests are no longer statutory, but as a school, we have decided to continue to use the tests in order to assess the children's knowledge, skills and understanding in reading, maths and spelling, grammar and punctuation (sometimes known as SPAG).

As a school, we receive very strict guidance on how and when we can administer these tests in school. However, we try to make the experience as stress free as possible for the children. We make sure that when they complete the tests they are working with staff that they know well and we keep everything as low key as possible. When we mention tests, sitting in silence in the sports hall in individual seats does spring to mind. Please be assured that this is nothing like how we tackle the tests in our school.

Keeping children safe online

In last week's newsletter we shared this link to an update from CEOPs and the National Crime Agency, which provides more information about financially motivated exploitation. Globally there has been an increase in reports of children and young people being victims of financially motivated sexual extortion, often referred to in the media as 'sextortion'.

Some people may think this issue would not apply to a first school, but any child who has access to a mobile phone or the internet could become involved. Please read up on this subject so you are aware of the dangers.

In addition to this, we have added information to our **school website** to support parents and carers to keep children safe online. Please visit the *support* for parents and carers tab in the key information tab of our school website for further guidance and support.

School site reminder

Children should not be on the **trim trail** before or after school. Children in Years 3 and 4 can play on the top yard before school but they should not be running around on the **field**, particularly when the field is wet. This week we've had children coming into school with soaking wet shoes and feet, and dirty uniform from playing on the field before school. Mud and grass were trailed into school, making a mess in the classrooms and corridors.

As per previous reminders, children should not be playing in the car park, on the grass around the car park or in the garden next to the drive before or after school.

We don't want to spoil anyone's fun but we would appreciate your support with this matter.

PEEP program

PEEP is a fun and friendly group for **parents** and carers with children from birth to 5 years of age. In PEEP groups we share ideas, songs, stories and activities that build on every day opportunities to support your child's learning, talking and social development through play. We have been running PEEP sessions on Monday mornings for one hour, with only one family attending. The sessions have been postponed and will be offered again next half term. These sessions are really useful. If you can spare one hour a week to support your child, please let Mrs Askew or Mrs Kembrey know. We will add your name to the list for next half term.

School visits

We have two school visits planned in the next few weeks.

Children in Nursery and Reception are going to **Whitehouse Farm** on Wednesday 22 May. Children in Years 1 to 3 are going to the **Children's Countryside Day** on Thursday 06 June.

We have asked for a **voluntary contribution of £5 per child per visit**. Both visits have been **heavily subsidised** using **£810** from fundraising to make the visits affordable to all. Without these subsidies, the visits would cost £21.45 and £10.85 per child respectively.
