



### Update from this week

What an unexpected start to the week and this half term. After our water was switched back on by Northumbria Water on Monday morning, their engineers came out to complete further work in the cavity of the man hole. This work caused a **catastrophic failure** of some kind, and some of the suspended ceiling in the hall collapsed, waterlogging the hall and hall corridor.

Thankfully, no-one was hurt which is the most important thing. We were able to sweep the water outside into the middle garden from the hall and the corridors. By the end of Monday, the hall was cleared and sanitised and air humidifiers were



installed to dry out the hall. This picture shows the current condition of the hall ceiling.

We lost all of our PE mats and the curtains, as they could not be sanitised because of the material they are made from. Our beautiful wooden parquet floor is not faring too well. It is drying out and moisture tests are being done to identify next steps. Air humidifiers are running 24 hours a day to try to dry things out.

We were able to reopen the school on Wednesday, although the hall is out of bounds until further notice. We have made a complaint to Northumbria Water about them switching off the water in the first place, meaning we had to close on Monday, and their actions which led to the collapse of the hall ceiling on Monday afternoon.

We have been able to operate without the hall for the rest of the week, hosting the book sale outside and Year 2 class assembly in the Year 2 classroom. PE lessons will continue as normal, however they will all have to be outside. If the weather is too bad for outdoor PE, the lesson will be cancelled. This will be the case until the hall is back in use, which may be some time.

Children in **Green class** were able to go on their visit to **Bamburgh** on Tuesday. They visited the RNLI Grace Darling museum, took part in a workshop then visited Grace Darling's memorial and the beach. The children have been learning about the shipwreck of the Forfarshire in 1838 and the actions of Grace and her family. This was a great opportunity for them to see lots of artefacts and resources about Grace's life as the daughter of a lighthouse keeper.

Our English lead, Mrs Watson, arranged an **author visit and book sale** on Wednesday. This was an amazing opportunity for our children to meet a real life author. **Toby Glover** is a local children's author with over 20 books. He worked with each key stage during the day, sharing his stories with all classes. We hosted the book sale after school on Wednesday and it was lovely to see so many people there.

**Year 2 class assembly** took place on Thursday. The children did an absolutely fantastic job telling us about the things they had enjoyed in of the three school terms. It was a great reminder of all of the topics, visits and activities the children have enjoyed this year. The children's enthusiasm and personalities shone through, which is how we would always want it to be. Well done Green class, and well done Miss Winter and Mrs Jose.

Thank you to everyone who came to school **wearing non-uniform** today and made a donation to **our summer fayre bottle tombola.** All money raised from the summer fayre will be used to subsidise treats and school visits so all children in our school experience special opportunities either free of charge or at a significantly reduced cost.
