#### Covid-19 advice

Respiratory infections, including the common cold and COVID-19, are common in children and young people, particularly during the winter months. For most children these illnesses will not be serious, and they will soon recover following rest and plenty of fluids.

Routine testing for COVID-19 ended in April 2022 and UK Health and Security Agency (UKHSA) guidance says it is **not recommended** that children are tested for COVID-19 unless directed to by a health professional.

As COVID-19 presents a low risk to children and young people, combined with high vaccination rates in the population, there are **no longer specific rules** relating to it in schools.

Children with **mild symptoms** of COVID-19 such as a runny nose, sore throat, or slight cough, who are otherwise well, **can continue to go to school**. However, those who are **unwell** and have a **high temperature** should **stay at home** and avoid contact with other people where they can. They can go back to school, and resume normal activities when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend. #### **Tax Free Childcare**

**Tax-Free Childcare (TFC)** is a new Government scheme which will give eligible families up to £2,000 per child towards childcare costs, including the fees for breakfast, after-school and holiday clubs. If you get Tax Free Childcare, you'll set up an online childcare account for your child. For every £8 you pay into this account, the government will pay in £2 to use to pay your provider. (Nursery parents: You can get Tax-Free Childcare at the same time as 15 or 30 hours free childcare if you're eligible for both).

#### Communication with parents and carers about behaviour in school

#### Communication between school and parents and carers

During the course of a school day, staff will undoubtedly speak to children about a number of things, ranging from very small things to sometimes, more serious things. We do not report every conversation we have with children to parents and carers- it would take all night and we wouldn't want to have a culture of negativity.

If your child has not followed the Golden Rules, or has behaved in a way that we need to speak to you about, please be assured that we will **speak to you about it directly**. We will ask to speak to you at the end of the school day, or we will telephone you and ask to speak to you then or at another agreed time.

#### Communication between parents and carers and school

If your child has been hurt or upset by another child, or if you think something is going on or something has happened that you think we may not be aware of, please speak to us immediately so we can work with you to investigate and resolve your concerns.

Please speak to us after school, email us at <u>schooladmin@seghillschool.co.uk</u> or ring school and leave a message at the office. Class teachers will speak to parents and carers in the morning when they open the doors, but at this time, their priority is to get the children into the classroom and to supervise them, so this isn't a good time to discuss a lengthy or important issue.

We know that there can be times when children "over report" or "partially report" something that has happened in school. This is when they only tell parents and carers what others have done or report only a snapshot of the school day. We know that there can also be times when reports to parents and carers by children can fixate on what one particular child has done, even when their actions had no direct impact on them. If this is the case with your child, please try to channel them into more positive conversations about all of the good things that have happened in school.

#### Summary

We know that the very vast majority of parents and carers engage with us in a positive way, approaching us directly if there is an issue. This is the best way to resolve any situation. We do not take your support for granted, but do appreciate it very much. If we do need to speak to you about your child's behaviour, we will speak to you directly.
