Christmas performances

We are delighted to be able to invite parents and carers into school to watch our Christmas concerts on Monday and Tuesday next week. Doors open at **8:45am** for the morning performances and **2:15pm** for the afternoon performance. Tickets have been sent home with your child today. Your tickets will show your seat numbers. Please sit in the **numbered seat** that you have been given. There are no spare seats. Seating has been allocated in the order that payments were received on School Gateway. If you have ordered more than one set of tickets at separate times, it is unlikely that all of your guests will be sitting together.

Live streaming and filming of the performances is not permitted. We have a number of children whose parents and carers have specified that they do not want their child's image shared in any way. **Please do not take photographs**. At the end of the performance, children will have the chance to see their adults and this will be the time when you can take pictures of your own child.

Please remember that **Cheviot View and Parker Place are pedestrian zones**. There is no parking on either of these streets for guests coming to our performances. A small number of spaces may be available on the grassed area at the back of the Institute, but leaving the car at home and walking is the best option.
