Advance notice of World Book Day

Staff have planned activities to take place on **World Book Day** on **Thursday 06 March**.

Mrs Watson has a **£1 book voucher** for every child. In addition to this, she has also managed to secure a free copy of one of the **£1** World Book Day books for every child in the school.

Please note that **we will not be dressing up** this year for World Book Day. We agreed some time ago that we would dress up every other year, and as we dressed up last year, we won't be dressing up this year.

The **coffee morning** will be taking place in the hall on Thursday 06 March from **8:45am**. Please drop your child off at their classroom door and come to the hall.

Hot drinks and juice will be available. In order to limit the financial burden on parents and carers, we will be charging **£1 per adult** to enter the coffee morning, but there will be **no charge for hot drinks**. Children will also be provided with a drink **free of charge** by school. There will be a **raffle** with World Book Day themed prizes.

In the past we have organised a book swap or book sale for World Book Day. This year we would like to do something different. Parents and carers will have the chance to enjoy a drink with their child in the hall, then move to the classroom to share a book with their child. Each class is taking part in the **decorate your door competition**. Children and staff will be decorating their classroom door in a book theme. We will share pictures of the doors on the newsletter the day after World Book Day. Which class will have the best decorated door?

All money raised from the entry fee and the raffle will be used directly to buy books for our children. We hope you can join us for our World Book Day coffee morning.

Water bottles

Lots of children bring their **water bottle** to school, which is really helpful. We do ask that children are provided with **water**, **rather than juice**. If there is a **medical reason** why your child has to have juice, or it is specified in a Health Care Plan, please let us know. We do hear that some children don't like water, but when staff refill bottles with water in school, children always drink the water they are given. ERROR ON LAST WEEK'S NEWSLETTER. Please note that I made an error on last week's newsletter about PE days for **Purple and Blue class** in Spring term B. Purple class will have PE on Mondays and Tuesdays. Blue class will have PE on Thursdays and Fridays. Apologies for this error.

Children should wear a **plain white t-shirt, plain black or navy joggers, trainers and their school sweatshirt or cardigan** to school on their PE days. Please ensure long hair is tied back for PE. Children cannot wear earrings for PE. If your child cannot remove their own earrings they should not wear them on PE days.

Huggg vouchers

Parents and carers of children eligible for Free School Meals have been sent their £20 holiday **Huggg voucher**. These vouchers are for children eligible for Free School Meals rather than for all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 who get a free school meal through the governments Universal Infant Free School Meals scheme.

Parking reminder- Cheviot View, Parker Place and Barrass Avenue

Thank you to the very vast majority of parents and carers to comply with our measures to keep our children safe around our school site every day. There are very few people who still park on Cheviot View at the restricted times, but there are still a few parents and carers who are doing this. There are still some ongoing issues which are really worrying us.

Barrass Avenue / Laycock Gardens

The **double yellow lines** on Barrass Avenue and Laycock Gardens are totally ignored by some parents and carers who park on them every day. The double yellow lines are there to keep our children safe. Please don't park on the double yellow lines.

Parker Place

This is a **private street** and is not a parking area for school traffic. I have received a number of complaints from residents of this street, which is totally understandable. **Please don't park here**.

Cheviot View and Parker Place

Cheviot View and Parker Place are pedestrian zones with access for residents only **between 8:15am to 9:15am and 2:45pm to 3:45pm.** This includes parents and carers who are dropping off and collecting children from Red and Green class or parking in either street to drop off or collect from any part of our school.

Virtual author visit

Mrs Watson has arranged for our school to take part in a **virtual author visit** on Wednesday 05 March. The author (and poet) is **Joseph Coelho**, who was the Children's Laureate from 2022 to 2024. Some of you with older children may remember that our children went to a workshop with Joseph Coelho at the Hexham Book Festival a couple of years ago.

Joseph Coelho grew up in a tower block in Roehampton. His earliest memory of writing a poem was for a competition when he was in secondary school. He didn't win, but it was the spark to ignite future poetry.

Joseph studied archaeology at university but continued to write poems. After a variety of jobs (gym instructor, salesman, film extra) and running creative writing workshops in schools, Joseph's first poetry collection, Werewolf Club Rules, was published in 2014 and he has never looked back.

Joseph has written a number of poetry books, short stories, picture books and a series of "fairy tales gone bad" books, including "Zombierella", "Frankenstiltskin" and "Creeping Beauty".
